The Advent wreath is an evergreen circle symbolizing God’s ever presence.

Four candles, designated by the early church to represent virtues of Christ, are lit in succession each Sunday.

Three candles are usually purple, the royal color, to remind us we are watching and preparing for our King; one candle is rose, representing love.

For in these last days you sent Jesus to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In Christ, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In Christ, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

### **Are You one of the 20?!**

Jamie Michaud delivered a very comprehensive report on the status of the 2022 pledge campaign at worship on Sunday. Here are some highlights:

- 29 of the 66 pledges in hand were made using the online feature on the website!
- Those pledges totaled \$183,523, with the average pledge 9% higher than 2021.
- More than half the households (36) have increased their pledge over 2021.
- 3 new households have pledged.
- 5 households who had lapsed in their pledging have returned for 2022!
