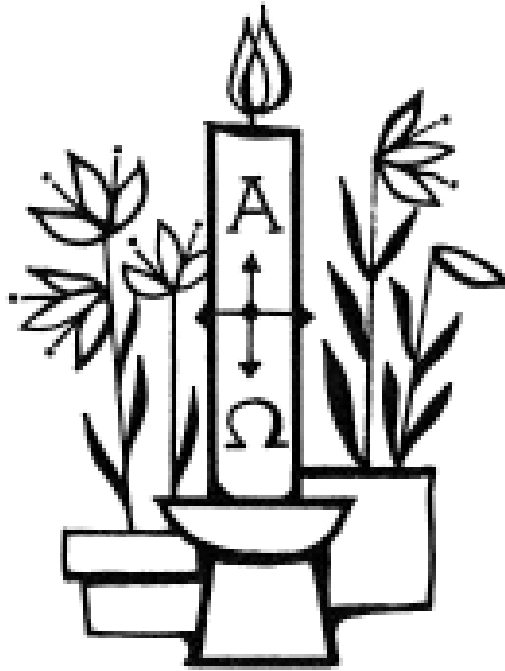

**The First Lesson: The Acts of the Apostles 5:27-32**

When the temple police had brought the apostles, they had them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, saying, "We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you are determined to bring this man's blood on us." But Peter and the apostles answered, "We must obey God rather than any human authority. The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Savior that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins. And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him."

*Reader:* Hear what the Spirit is saying to God's people.*People:* **Thanks be to God.**

### The Second Lesson: The Revelation to John 1:4-8

John to the seven churches that are in Asia: Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne, and from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth.

To him who loves us and freed us from our sins by his blood, and made us to be a kingdom, priests serving his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.

Look! He is coming with the clouds; every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and on his account all the tribes of the earth will wail. So it is to be. Amen. "I am the Alpha and the Omega," says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.

*Reader:* Hear what the Spirit is saying to the Churches.

*People:* **Thanks be to God.**

### The Gospel Lesson: John 20:19-31

*Presider:* The Holy Gospel of our Savior, Jesus Christ, according to John.

*People:* **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

*The Presider continues:*

Praise and thanksgiving be to you, Gracious God, for by the Cross eternal life is ours and death is swallowed up in victory. In the first light of Easter, glory broke from the tomb and changed the women's sorrow into joy. From the Garden the mystery dawned the one whom they loved was not lost to them. Jesus is with us now in every place for ever.

Before he was given up to suffering and death, at supper with his disciples Jesus took bread and offered you thanks. He broke the bread, and gave it to them, saying: "Take, eat. This is my Body: it is broken for you." After supper, he took the cup, he offered you thanks, and gave it to them saying: "Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new covenant; it is poured out for you, and for all, that sins may be forgiven. Do this in remembrance of me."

*Presider:* So, as we do what he told us,

*People:* **we open our hearts to him;  
we remember how he died  
and rose again to live now in us.**

*Presider:* Together with him we offer you these gifts:

*People:* **in them we give you ourselves.**

Hear us, most merciful God, and send your Holy Spirit upon us and upon this bread and this wine, that they may be the Body and Blood of your Son. Kindle the fire of your love in us, and renew us for the service of your Kingdom.

Help us, who are baptized into the fellowship of Christ's Body, to live and work to your praise and glory; that we may grow together in unity and love and at the last, in your new creation, we may join the company of apostles, prophets, and all our brothers and sisters living and departed. All this we ask through our Redeemer, Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **AMEN.**

### St. Bart's Spring Blood Drive

The Spring, 2022 St. Bart's Blood Drive will run on **next Tuesday**, April 26, from 12:00 noon until 6:00 pm. As always, volunteers are needed to participate in various ways, the most important of which is to donate blood. If you haven't already done so, you should **make an appointment by calling 1-800-REDCROSS (1-800-733-2767). It is not too late, even to register on Tuesday morning.**

#### **If you are unable to donate blood, here are some ways you can contribute to the success of the drive:**

1. After the church service on Sunday morning, we need to remove the furniture from the center of the sanctuary. Please stay after the service for an extra 5-10 minutes to lend a hand.
2. During the drive, members of St. Bart's customarily staff the registration desk. This involves greeting donors as they arrive, confirming their identity and assuring that they have completed the required advance reading. After donating, donors are asked to remain at the "canteen table" for ten to fifteen minutes, so that the professional staff can observe that they do not have any adverse reaction to the donation process. Volunteers staff the canteen, which involves extending refreshments and hospitality to all donors, but especially to those who are visitors to St. Bart's. We have developed a reputation for our hospitality and the quality of the refreshments we offer.
3. We welcome in-kind contributions to the canteen from any St. Bart's members who are unable to be present during the drive. Healthy baked goods, cheese and crackers, fresh fruit and vegetables are always popular. Such items can be left in the church kitchen refrigerator on Monday and Tuesday when the building is open. Please leave a list of ingredients with prepared goods if they are not obvious, and be sensitive to potential food allergies in your choice of items to donate.
4. Finally, we will need volunteers to help reset the furniture in the sanctuary once the drive has ended. This also need not take long, and it can be done right after the Red Cross has cleaned up their equipment (say 7:00 pm or later) on Tuesday evening, or early Wednesday.

**Sign up sheets have been posted in the entryway. It will be helpful to know who can bring edible goods, and who can be present (and when). Please sign up for what you can do. If you don't sign up, but find that you can contribute to the effort, please let Peter Chandler know (207-232-7051) or just show up.**

There are now over 100 New Mainers living in temporary housing at a hotel in Yarmouth. Thirty-seven children have entered into the school system. The Yarmouth School Department and Yarmouth Community Services are working tirelessly to support this massive influx of people seeking asylum here in our town.

The week of April 17th, is spring break for the Yarmouth Schools. Wednesday, April 20th, the families gathered at the Rowe School to enjoy meals prepared by those from their home countries, play on the playground and soccer field and enjoy some time away from the hotel. YCHI funds were used to provide the meals and a few students and teachers from the schools came to be guides and helpers and companions.

### **LD1626 - Restoring Tribes' Sovereignty**

The Maine Senate advanced a historic proposal Friday to restore tribes' sovereignty, ensuring they have the same rights as other federally recognized tribes across the country. The Senate action, made without debate, came a day after the House approved the bill that addresses sovereignty rights that were forfeited by tribes under the Maine Indian Claims Settlement Act of 1980.
