- Body cleansing wipes
- Talc free body powder

Cleaning & Toiletry Kit

- All purpose spray
- Toilet bowl cleaner
- Dish soap
- Laundry detergent
- Broom
- Dustpan
- Hand/ body soap
- Shampoo
- Conditioner
- Trash bags

*Assemble in any kind of bag with a handle or in a much needed kitchen trash can!

Sunshine Kit

- Soccer ball
- Bubbles
- Frisbee
- Jump rope
- Sidewalk chalk
- Shovel & pail
- Kid sunscreen

*assemble in a bag with handle, paper bag is fine

Minute for Mom Kit

- a handmade soap
- tea and chocolate
- a candle or essential oil
- facial mask or cleanser
- moisturizing lotion
- salt or sugar scrub
- mascara, nail polish or lip gloss
- headband, hair ties
